Title of Topic:	Presentation on Groundwater Ambient Monitoring and Assessment Program	20 mins
Purpose:	Informational: We would like to understand how the white paper recommendations might dovetail with the needs presented in the GAMA program, with respect to data sharing.	
Background:	Dorian Bellan with the <u>Groundwater Ambient Monitoring and Assessment Program</u> will present the past decisions, present status, and future plans for this important program within the State Water Resources Control Board. She will focus primarily on information collection, processing, and distribution. Included in her presentation will be a discussion featuring their flagship product, <u>GeoTracker GAMA</u> .	
	Given our recent presentation from DWR's Abdul Khan regarding his team's groundwater data management strategy still in development, we might find the comparison to another data management system insightful.	

Desired Outcome:	Information and planning: We might apply lessons learned through the GAMA program and its ongoing challenges to our Steering Committee meeting agenda.	
Notes:	Dori's presentation of the tools available revealed a number of aspects of data management that were useful to note. Her program receives occasional updates from DWR regarding well location and status. These data are delivered via a hard drive on regular intervals.	
	Their default position is toward openness, wherever possible. Dori suggested that they are continuing to explore ways that their systems might deliver even more timely data.	
	Their IT consultants are very responsive and capable and able to evolve the system over time.
