| Purpose: | Decision: We would like to share proposed materials related to the Steering Committee agenda as well as the near-term plan for its continuity | |
| Background: | In February 2016, the DMWG made a request to the California Water Quality Monitoring Council to authorize the formation of a Steering Committee to help advance the work of the DMWG in ways that align with agency goals. Most | |

significantly, the Steering Committee would: provide authoritative guidance on workgroup activities in support of the Vision Document recommendations and related goals comprise mid- and high-level decision makers within Natural Resources, DWR, DFW, SWRCB, Delta Conservancy, and Delta Stewardship Council help promote resources for interagency coordination (and communication) regarding new and ongoing technology initiatives ensure consistent and broadly representative meeting attendance and initiative support Since February, a solicitation was composed, members selected, and a meeting scheduled. The Sept 9th meeting will be the first of several upcoming meetings, likely convened on a quarterly frequency. As part of the review by the DMWG, we will provide an opportunity to discuss a glossary, data initiative survey, and the Steering Committee agenda itself. **Desired Outcome:** 1) Information and planning: We should all share in the approach to managing the Steering Committee's trajectory. 2) Review materials: The workgroup should have an opportunity to review the materials prior to broader circulation with the Steering Committee 3) Meeting proceedings: We must approve a finalized agenda for the inaugural meeting and agreement on the development of a draft charter. tonyh@sfei.org, (510) 746-7381 **Contact Person:** Tony Hale Attachment: AB 1755 Enrolled.pdf Notes: Tony presented information on the Steering Committee, which will hold its first meeting on Friday afternoon. He presented a draft agenda and a definitions document and received workgroup feedback. AB 1755, The Open and Transparent Water Data Act, will be mentioned but not discussed in detail, since it has not yet been signed by the Governor. Tasks in the proposed legislation could enhance the relevance of the Steering Committee and the Data Management Workgroup, as it calls for development of interagency "protocols for data sharing, documentation, quality control, public access, and promotion of open-source platforms and decision support tools related to water data." Tony will ask each member so spend 5 minutes discussing personal or departmental data initiatives, as a means of demonstrating relevance of the forum to addressing each organization's needs. Tony mentioned that the Steering Committee would likely meet quarterly. Jon stressed the need for a second and longer meeting to occur sooner, in order that specific recommendations could be developed. Should AB 1755 become law, deadlines for specific actions begin January 1, 2018. For the Steering Committee and workgroup to be relevant in implementing legislative tasks.
