## Procedure to Select or Develop a Classification System for California Wetlands

## 12/18/2009

The Technical Advisory Team (TAT) for the California Wetland and Riparian Area Protection Policy will recommend a wetland classification system to the Policy Development Team (PDT). The classification system will be an integral part of State Wetland and Riparian Area Monitoring Program (WRAMP). For this purpose of selecting or developing a wetlands classification system, the TAT will consist of experts in habitat mapping, classification, and general wetland science. After the TAT has achieved this purpose, some of its members will join other scientists to form the Mapping Committee of the California Wetland Monitoring Workgroup (CWMW).
