- USEPA has issued guidance to states
 - Requires Section 303(d) list and Section 305(b) report to be integrated
 - The California Integrated Report includes:
 - 303(d) List
 - 305(b) Report


Integrated Report (305b/303d)

Category	Description
1	All designated uses met
2	Some, but not all, designated uses met
3	Cannot determine if any designated uses met
4	Impaired/threatened -TMDL not needed
4a	TMDL completed
4b	TMDL alternative
4c	Non-pollutant causes
5	Impaired/threatened by pollutant –TMDL needed

EPA's Integrated Report Guidance (IRG) developed for 2002, 2004, 2006 and 2008 reporting cycles (www.epa.gov/owow/tmdl/)

- Summary 303(d) List
 - The 303(d) List Includes 3,470 water pollutant combinations
 - 1,266 new listings
 - A total of 124 water body pollutant combinations were delisted

2010 Integrated Report Status

- Approved by State Water Board on August 4, 2010
- Submitted to USEPA for final approval

- Notice of Data Solicitation on January 14, 2010
- Deadline extended from June to Aug 30, 2010
- 160 data submissions were received

- Data Solicitation Outreach
- In addition of the Data Solicitation Notice
 - government agencies
 - regional monitoring programs
 - NPDES receiving water data

- Data and Information Received
 - Each of the 160 submissions included one or multiple data sets
 - Data were reviewed for completeness according to the Data Submittal Requirements
 - Data will be QA reviewed prior to water quality assessment

- Staff will identify any missing information for submitted data
- Data submitters will receive a request for missing information
- Only data with poor QA will not be used

- Data and information will be available to the Regional Water Boards
- A list of data and information received will be posted on the State Water Board website

- Next Steps
 - The centralized database (CalWQA) is not available until after USEPA's final approval
 - State Water Board staff will use Excel Spreadsheets to prepare the Lines of Evidence
 - The Lines of Evidence and data will be will be available for Regional Water Board input through a project management tool called WebCollab
