# WATER QUALITY MONITORING COUNCIL PURSUANT TO SENATE BILL 1070 (KEHOE, 2006): REPLACEMENT MEMBER RECOMMENDATION

Dear Secretaries Rodriquez and Laird:

On November 26, 2007, the Secretaries for Environmental Protection and Natural Resources signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) establishing the California Water Quality Monitoring Council (Council) as required by SB 1070. Following the signing of the MOU, we were directed to develop a potential list of Council members, which were presented to the Agency Secretaries in April 2008. The list of members was approved in May and the Council had its first meeting in June. Pursuant to the legislation, the Monitoring Council developed and on December 1, 2008 submitted to the Agency Secretaries recommendations for maximizing the efficiency and effectiveness of existing water quality data collection and dissemination, and for ensuring that collected data are maintained and available for use by decision makers and the public. Also pursuant to the legislation, the Monitoring Council developed and on December 28, 2010 submitted to the Agency secretaries a recommended Comprehensive Monitoring Program Strategy for California to guide the Monitoring Council's activities into the future.

One of ten positions on the Monitoring Council represents the regulated community–publicly owned treatment works. For the past five years, Mike Connor has held that position. In April of 2015, Mr. Connor tendered his resignation and the California Association of Sanitation Agencies recommended that Phil Markle of the County Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County (LACSD) replace Mr. Connor on the Council.

Mr. Markle has served as the Alternate to Mr. Connor and is well versed in the activities and priorities of the Council. He is has extensive relevant experience,

including eight years as an Environmental Scientist for LACSD evaluating current and proposed environmental regulations and 17 years of experience as a Biologist and Supervising Biologist conducting regulatory and research-related chronic toxicity testing and ecological assessments of southern California rivers. Mr. Markle earned a B.S. in Marine Biology at California State University, Long Beach and an M.S. in Environmental Management at the University of San Francisco. His curriculum vita is enclosed.

To ensure that the Monitoring Council continues to move forward to implement the requirements of SB 1070, we would appreciate your decision regarding the proposed Council Member replacement as outlined above by June 12, 2015. We will assume that you concur with this change if we have not received a response by this date.
