In the discussion that ensued, this question arose – What would be the likely future of each of the workgroup and portal development efforts should we fail to achieve broad management support and sustainable funding for implementing the strategy?</p> <p>Stephanie will be providing Jon with brief potential future scenarios for the CEMW by March 14th.</p>

Notes:	<p>A discussion on the future of the work if funding from SFCWA stopped.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DWR would continue to support the workgroup through the reporting of the water quality conditions reporting through the Portal. DWR is currently pursuing a contract with 34 North to continue developing the interactive report on the Estuary Portal. DWR is also setting up a pilot program with ESRI to incorporate GIS layers with the water quality and biological data collected through the EMP. • Theoretically there will be a budget for the Delta RMP, which will support data sharing. • The Delta Conservancy is willing to contribute staff time to focus on habitat issues. If a water bond passes, it is possible they will have funds to contribute on top of staff time. • USFWS is still willing to provide data and staff time 	

	The agencies and participants in the CEMW are still very willing to provide staff time and portal content. However, the workgroup does not have a source of sustainable funding if SFCWA does not provide it.

If it is possible to get 	

	<p>interactive data in the near future, no time will be spent updating static graphs for this section.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 14-3 Habitat <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The timeline for updating this session is reflective of the October 2015 release of the State of the Estuary Report. Main task include identifying attributes and indicators for the Delta (this has already been done for the Bay). Section lead will also focus on outreach with other estuaries. • 14-4 Fish <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The first updates to these pages will focus on function of current information already provided. The Attribute leads hope to layout a more user-friendly format. There is also a possibility of incorporating a webservice with USFWS servers to incorporate Juvenile delta fish monitoring data and special project data. • 14-5 Water <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The workplan lays out splitting this attribute into Quantity and Quality. ○ The Quantity section will focus on the basic understanding of hydrology in the delta. This is a complicated system and the workgroup recognizes they will not be able to describe the entire water delivery system. A good resource for these pages will be the Water Quality Conditions Report Chapter 1. ○ The Quality section will be set up in stages. Basic Vital sign information on water quality, then moving into what impairments there are (303D List) and then TMDLs. • 14-6 Birds <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The bird section will focus mostly on outreach with organizations that have more data that could be displayed on the portal. • 14-7 Ecological Process <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The attribute lead hopes to bring in other processes and make the current Foodweb section more interactive. <p>All attribute leads should meet with their workerbees and finalize these workplans and develop timelines for deliverables. Attribute leads should structure their updates on the question/answer format that the Monitoring Council has requested.</p> <p>CEMW Members were also asked to check with their management about how involvement in the CEMW will help achieve common goals.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DWR will continue to work on providing support to meet their d-1641 reporting requirements through the portal. • Delta RMP- once developed, monitoring requirements could be reported out through the portal <p>Coordination between other estuaries has begun. Stephanie Fong has met with Jessica Martin-Lamb about the Russian River, Karina Johnston and Eric Stein about Santa Monica Bay, and Jennifer Nix from the Morro Bay National Estuary Program. She will continue to coordinate and see how these estuaries can be incorporated into the Portal. Kristal Davis Fadtker and Stephanie Fong have also been working with Ross Clark (Moss Landing) to add language and a \$10,000</p>
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	match to an EPA grant.
