Webinar Topic	<b>Clean Water Act (CWA) § 303(d) and 305(b) Data Format Solicitation Webinar:</b> This Webinar will discuss the data submittal requirements and explain the water quality assessment process for the developing of California Integrated Report.
Topic Description	The State Water Resources Control Board solicitate data and information from public regarding water quality conditions in surface waters of California. Information gathered will be used to provide the basis for both identifying and listing impaired waters, and for assessing overall surface water quality conditions in California for the development of the California Integrated Report. The State and Regional Water Boards are responsible for performing assessments and developing the California Integrated Report that includes the requirements of Clean Water Act Section 303 (d) and Section 305 (b).
